Turn off the server and disconnect the power cord, telecommunications systems, networks, and modems attached to the server before opening it. Electrostatic discharge (ESD) and ESD protection: ESD can damage disk drives, boards, and other parts. We recommend that you perform all procedures in this chapter only at an ESD workstation. If one is not available, provide some ESD protection by wearing an anti-static wrist strap attached to chassis ground (any unpainted metal surface) on your server when handling parts.

ESD and handling boards: Always handle boards carefully. They can be extremely sensitive to ESD. Hold boards only by their edges. After removing a board from its protective wrapper or from the server, place the board component side up on a grounded, static free surface. Use a conductive foam pad if available but not the board wrapper. Do not slide board over any surface.

Installing or removing jumpers: A jumper is a small plastic encased conductor that slips over two jumper pins. Some jumpers have a small tab on top that you can grip with your fingertips or with a pair of fine needle nosed pliers. If your jumpers do not have such a tab, take care when using needle nosed pliers to remove or install a jumper; grip the narrow sides of the jumper with the pliers, never the wide sides. Gripping the wide sides can damage the contacts inside the jumper, causing intermittent problems with the function controlled by that jumper. Take care to grip with, but not squeeze, the pliers or other tool you use to remove a jumper, or you may bend or break the pins on the board.

Cooling Fan Kit Install Guide

This install guide provides the specific steps required to replace a failed cooling fan in the Intel® Entry Storage System SS4200-E. The cooling fan should only be replaced if it has been properly diagnosed by trained service personnel as functioning improperly or not working at all.

Tools Needed

• #1 or #2 Phillips* screwdriver

Caution: Before performing any maintenance on the system, back up the data. Follow the instructions in the operating system manual or third-party software documentation for shutting down the system.

- Hot surfaces
- Access to power supply unit openings

Warning: Upon completion of cooling fan replacement, the enclosure cover MUST be properly reinstalled to ensure adequate cooling of the system.

Prepare System

1. Read all caution and safety statements and observe all ESD precautions listed in this document before performing any of the steps. Caution: Before performing any maintenance on the system, back up the data.

- 2. Check the new cooling fan for damage. If any damage exists, return the cooling fan to your vendor for replacement.
- 3. Turn off all peripheral devices connected to the storage system. Power down the system.
- 4. Disconnect the AC power cord.




Figure 1. Disconnecting Power Cord

5. Release the enclosure cover by loosening the two captive screws at the rear of the system (see letter "A" in the following figure). Slide the enclosure cover to the rear (see letter "B") and then lift to remove from the system (see letter "C").




Figure 2. Removing Enclosure Cover

Replacing Cooling Fan

To Replace Left Cooling Fan

6. Lift the left side of the drive tray assembly (see letter "A" in the following figure).




Figure 3. Lifting Left Side of Drive Tray Assembly

7. Disconnect the fan power cable from the system board (see letter "A" in the following figure). Remove the two screws securing the fan assembly to the chassis (see letter "B"). Remove the fan assembly (see letter "C").




Figure 4. Removing Faulty Left Cooling Fan

8. Position the new cooling fan assembly in the system (see letter "A" in the following figure). Secure the fan assembly to the chassis with the two screws previously removed (see letter "B"). Connect the fan power cable to the SYS FAN2 connector (J10) on the system board (see letter "C").




Figure 5. Installing New Left Cooling Fan

9. Return the left side of the drive tray assembly to its operational position (see letter "A" in the following figure).




Figure 6. Lowering Left Side of Drive Tray Assembly

To Replace Right Cooling Fan

10. Lift the right side of the drive tray assembly (see letter "A" in the following figure).




Figure 7. Lifting Right Side of Drive Tray Assembly

11. Disconnect the fan power cable from the system board (see letter "A" in the following figure). Remove the two screws securing the fan assembly to the rear of the chassis (see letter "B"). Remove the fan assembly (see letter "C").




Figure 8. Removing Right Faulty Cooling Fan

12. Position the new cooling fan assembly in the system (see letter "A" in the following figure). Secure the fan assembly to the chassis with the two screws previously removed (see letter "B"). Connect the fan power cable to the SYS FAN1 connector (J4B1) on the system board (see letter "C").




Figure 9. Installing New Right Cooling Fan

13. Return the right side of the drive tray assembly to its operational position (see letter "A" in the following figure).




Figure 10. Lowering Right Side of Drive Tray Assembly

Complete Setup

14. Re-install the enclosure cover. Align the enclosure cover over the sides of the system (see letter "A" in the following figure). Slide the enclosure cover toward the front of the system (see letter "B"). Secure the enclosure cover to the system by tightening the captive screws at the rear of the system (see letter "C").




Figure 11. Re-installing Enclosure Cover

- 15. Re-connect all peripheral devices and the AC power cord.
- 16. Power up the storage system.
